# - M DANGER -

Touch panel switches should NOT be used to make a switch that could result in human injury or equipment damage. If the GP main unit, devices, or cables have a problem which could keep the output ON or OFF, a serious accident could result. An output signal that could result in a serious accident must be equipped with a monitoring circuit such as a limiter. Also, the system must be designed for important actions to be conducted from a device other than the GP main unit, to prevent an accident due to false output or malfunction.

- GP-Pro EX installation disk is a CD-ROM. Never play the CD-ROM on an audio CD player. Unexpected volume may lead to hearing loss or speaker damage.
